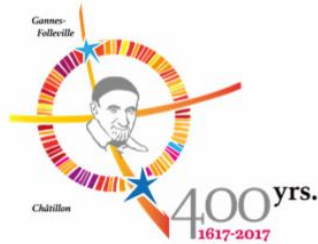

Disasters Nationally*

Residents in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands still struggling after Fall Hurricanes

Hurricane Maria made its first landfall on the Caribbean island nation of Dominica on Monday, September 18, 2017 as a Category 5 storm with winds howling up to 160 mph. Days later, the storm devastated the U.S. territory of Puerto Rico, according to CNN.

The U.S. Virgin Islands were dealt two devastating blows when they were hit hard by Hurricane Irma and then Hurricane Maria just 14 days later. According to the New York Times, Maria drowned and destroyed what Irma did not, leaving the Islands in ruins.

SVdP Disaster Services are still needed! The SVdP Disaster Services Corporation deployed a team of 14 volunteers to Puerto Rico from Dec. 2-9, 2017. While there, they hosted two Parish Recovery Assistance Centers (P-RACs) where they served families that had been devastated by Hurricanes Maria, Irma and poverty.

Two more P-RACs are being planned to open in January 2018 in San Juan, Puerto Rico. A deployment to assist in the U.S. Virgin Islands is being considered for February 2018. Both the U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico are still declared under a State of Emergency.

While you may not be able to be on the ground in the impacted areas, you can help with the extensive recovery effort from home. Your contribution is critical to meeting the needs of those of who have lost everything!

QUESTIONS And Answers

Q: We have a Conference president approaching the end of her second term and trying to plan her succession. No current member of this active Conference seems willing to step up to succeed her. If that does not change, what should happen with the Conference?

A: There are two choices, either elect someone from within or close the Conference. It is up to the Conference members to step forward and provide leadership for their Conference. A District Council president can temporarily appoint someone to be Conference president if no president is nominated before the current president term ends; but an election has to take place as soon as possible and within a reasonable time. The current president should NOT stay in office by either appointment or re-election.

Q: Can you cite how often Councils (not Conferences) are to meet? I can't seem to locate this information in "The Rule."

A: District Council meeting frequencies may be determined based on the criteria described in Article 13, page 129 of the National Bylaws.

We are working hard with the vendor to resolve these problems; meanwhile, the online annual reporting capability will not be accessible. At this time we anticipate the online reporting capability to be available in January 2018.

As a result the online annual report data entry deadlines have been extended as follows:

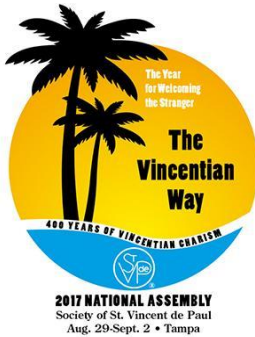
Thrift Store & Special Works Annual Reports:

501 (c) (3) Tax Exemption Notice

In October of 2016, the Society began a two-year plan to transition all Councils and Conferences (except Isolated Conferences) off the Society's Section 501(c)(3) Group Ruling with the IRS (GEN 5496).

As the deadline approaches, October 1, 2018, we take this opportunity to remind leadership of the need to take action to plan a smooth transition to the tax exempt process your Council will undertake. The options contain step-by-step instructions for you to implement the necessary changes for your Conference and/or Council. We recommend Conferences and Councils work with their local attorney or accountant to help with the transition as needed.

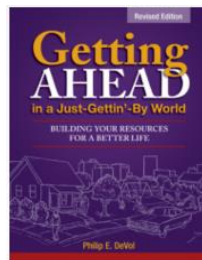

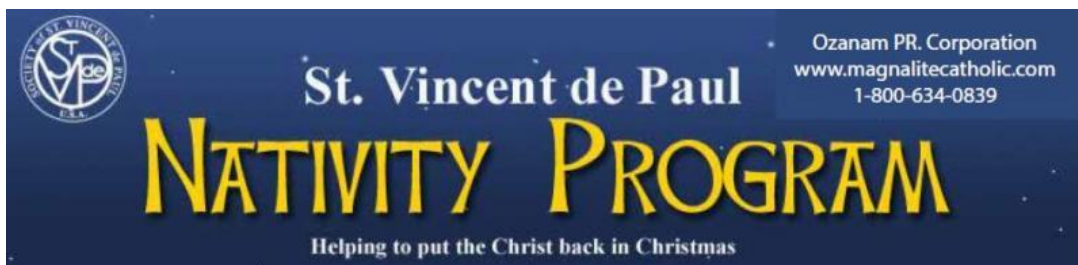

He 'gave up,' but then St. Vincent de Paul put him back on Track with a Job

PITTSBURGH, CA:

James Neitte clearly isn't the shy, retiring type, but he looked down at the floor as he said - voice trailing off - he was "in a bad spot" last spring. Then a friend handed him a flier for the St. Vincent de Paul Workforce Development Program.

With skills in construction, Neitte was a finalist for several jobs over the past few years, but a felony conviction in 2011 on firearms charges, and six months served in the Contra Costa County Jail, ultimately torpedoed him. Some of those employers, he said, were brutally honest about that.

"I just gave up applying," said Neitte, a Pinole resident. "My confidence was below zero."

He and four other people with "barriers to employment" - time behind bars, or substance abuse problems, or homelessness - graduated in October from the six-month Workforce Development Program at St. Vincent de Paul. It was tailor-made for people like Neitte who want to turn their lives around despite such obstacles.
